Useful Imperial to Metric Conversions:

## 1 inch $\approx 2.5 \mathrm{~cm}$ <br> 1 foot $\approx 30 \mathrm{~cm}=0.3 \mathrm{~m}$ <br> 1 mile $\approx 1.6 \mathrm{~km}$

To convert inches to centimetres, multiply by 2.5. To convert centimetres to inches, divide by 2.5 . Use the conversions above to answer the questions below:
(You may use a calculator to help you, but always check that your answers are sensible)
Example:


The London Eye is 440 feet high.
using 1 foot $\approx 30 \mathrm{~cm}$ :
$440 \times 30=13200 \mathrm{~cm}=132 \mathrm{~m}$
